Antigua and Barbuda	Antigua and Barbuda Hospitality Training Institute (ABHTI)	The vision of ABHTI is to be the premier Hospitality and Tourism Training Institute in the Organization of Eastern Caribbean States (OECS) and wider Caribbean. The mission is to produce a quality skilled workforce and professionals for the Hospitality and Tourism Industry and to provide training and education with a commitment to excellence and to equip persons to work in the hospitality and tourism industry with a high degree of professionalism.
	Antigua and Barbuda Institute of Continuing Education (ABICE)	The Antigua and Barbuda Institute of Continuing Education (ABICE) was established in 1985 to train youth to enter the work force at entry-level positions or to assist them in opening small business such as beekeeping and small agricultural production. In 2005, the institute was renamed (ABICE) which gave rise to a similar curriculum to include beauty care, fashion design and business studies. Currently, the institute's curriculum affords regional certification which gives graduates the opportunity to access the job market across the region. A life skills program is coupled with an adolescent development program which prepares trainees to seek, take and keep jobs. ABICE is funded by the Government of Antigua and Barbuda.
	Directorate of Gender Affairs, Ministry of Education, Gender, Sports and Youth Affairs	The Directorate of Gender Affairs (DOGA) directs its attention towards the structural and systemic causes of gender inequality, channeling energies towards changing the socio-economic and political conditions impacting persisting imbalances. The DOGA is the national women's agency for gender equality and women's empowerment. In order to promote gender mainstreaming and improve gender sensitization through all facets of social and public life, DOGA works collaboratively with state agencies, private partners and civil society organizations
	Gilbert Agricultural & Rural Development (GARD) Center	The Gilbert Agricultural & Rural Development (GARD) Center is a non-governmental organization under the auspices of the Methodist Church in the Caribbean and the Americas. Founded 22 years ago as an entrepreneurial training facility for youth and women, the Center has diversified its mandate to focus more on vulnerable youth, providing them a second chance and filling an important gap for persons who have dropped out of school, single mothers and other youth at risk. Partnership with CYEP, combined with bringing local partners on board, has created holistic programs to include internship and job placement programs, life skills, ICT and remedial courses, all of which give youth on a competitive edge. Algeria	National Agency for the Management of Microcredit (ANGEM), Ministry of National Solidarity and Family	An instrument of the government's policy for the fight against unemployment and job insecurity, the National Agency for the Management of the Microcredit's (ANGEM) missions include managing the microcredit mechanism in accordance with the legislation and regulation in force and supporting, advising and assisting the beneficiaries in the implementation of their activities. The agency is in charge of establishing a database on the activities and beneficiaries of the mechanism, maintaining an ongoing relationship with the banks and financial institutions within the scope of the projects' financial set-up, the implementation of the financing plan, and monitoring the implementation and operation of projects and participating in the recovery of the outstanding debts on time.
	Ministry of National Solidarity and Family	The Algerian Ministry of National Solidarity and Family oversees a variety of social aid programs for Algerians. The ministry includes the Agency for Social Development (ADS), which provides grants to poor families, carries out public works projects, and engages in community development. It also includes the National Agency for Microcredit Management (ANGEM), which provides microcredit and related support services to borrowers.
Argentina	Fundación Pescar	Pescar Foundation's mission is to help and promote vulnerable youth into the labor force in quality jobs, through an intensive training in personal and professional skills.
