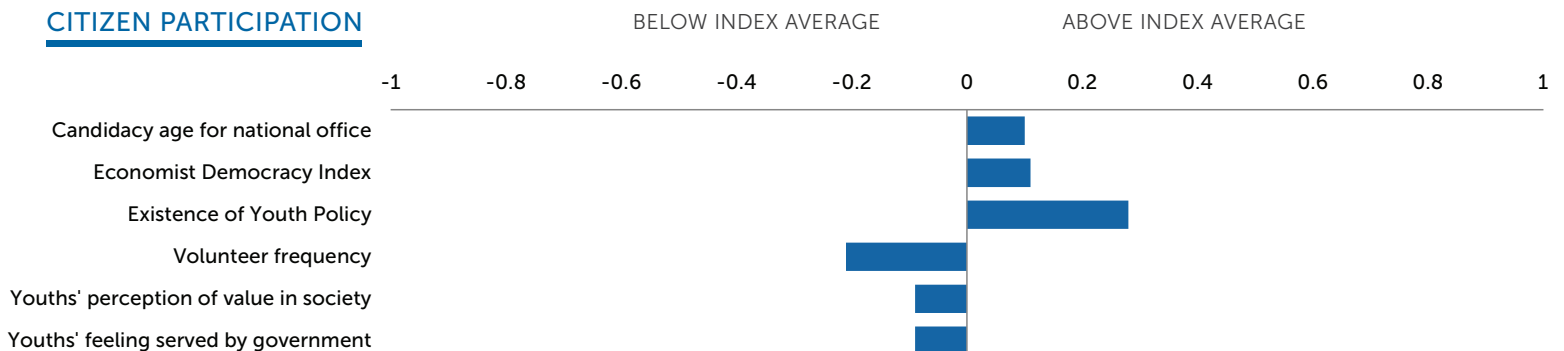

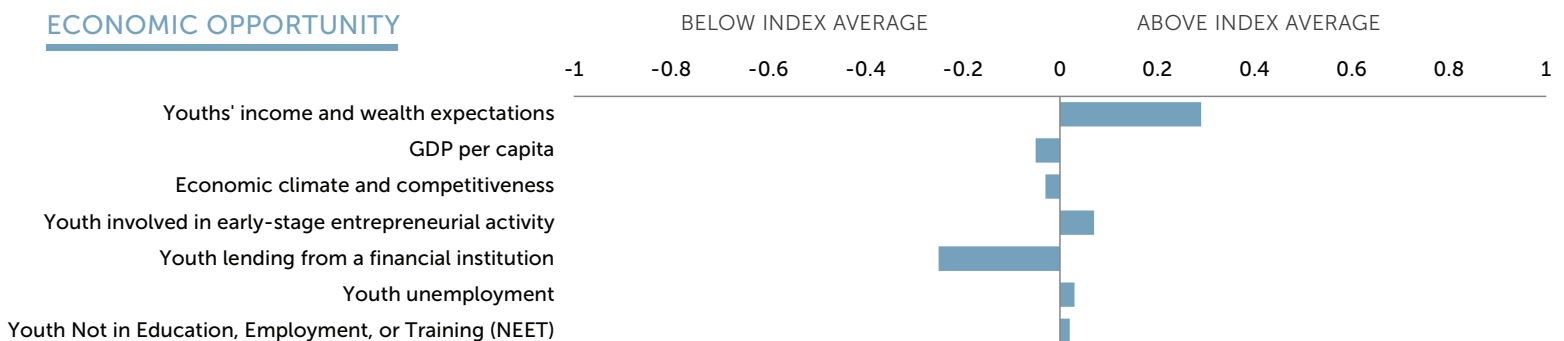
Upper Middle

AT 15TH, BRAZIL places in the third of the four tiers of youth wellbeing alongside several of its upper-middle income peers. Brazil ranks second-to-last among countries in the Americas region. Brazil's overall ranking is negatively impacted by its low safety and security ranking, which is due largely to higher levels of interpersonal violence and youths' concern of violence. Across the domains, youth are optimistic in some areas of their lives, such as their wealth expectations, and concerned more with feeling valued by society.
