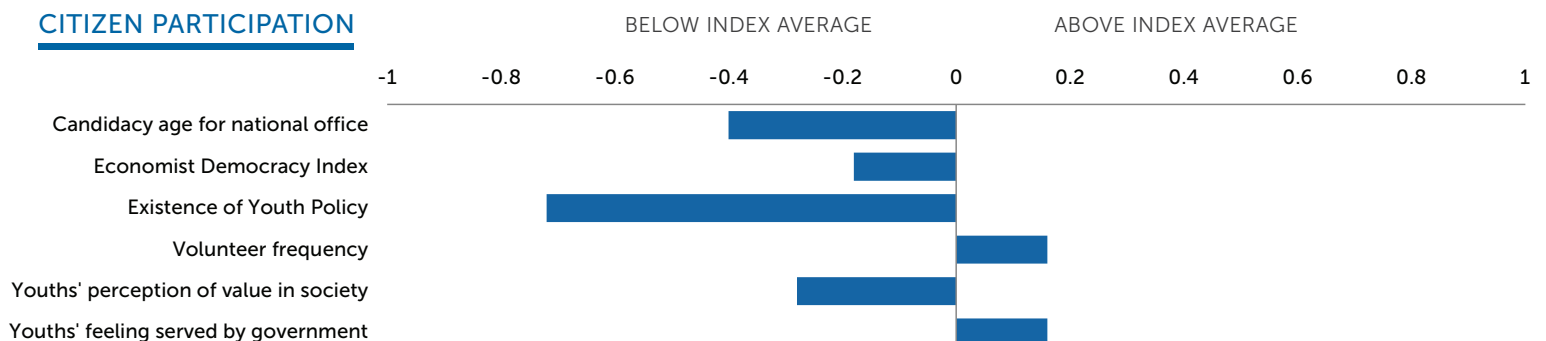

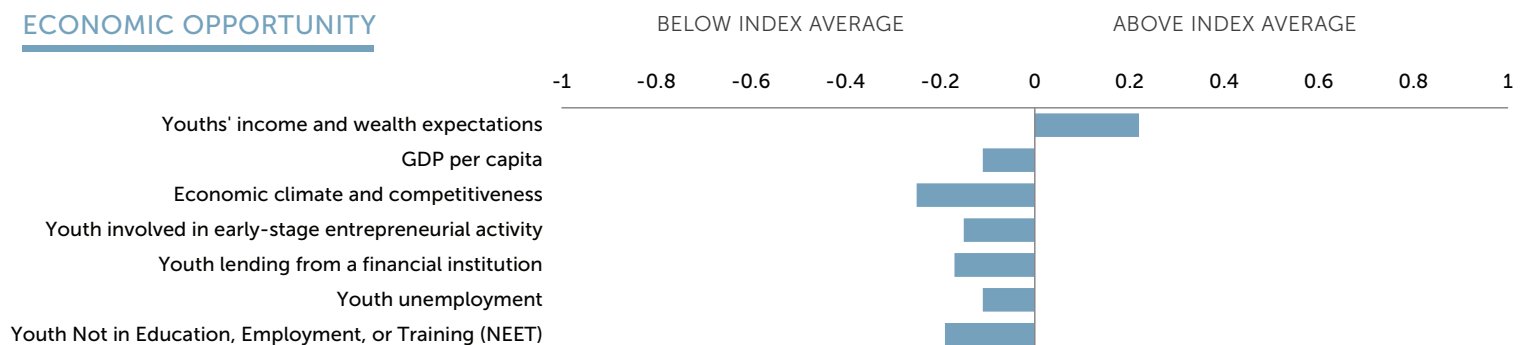

AT 24TH PLACE, EGYPT lands in the last of four tiers of youth wellbeing and ranks relative to its income peer group, but lowest of the countries in the Middle East-North Africa region. Egypt's scores are low across domains, with the exception of health. Generally, youth are less optimistic across domains, particularly in citizen participation, but are more positive about their economic prospects.
